<u>Transforming Education: The Think Equal System Change</u>

Leslee Udwin (UK)

Leslee is the founder and CEO of Think Equal. She is an education activist, and a film maker. As a result of the insights she discovered whilst making her documentary, India's Daughter, she started a global initiative to end violence against women and girls.

Leslee was voted by the NY Times as the No 2 Most Impactful Women of 2015, second to Hilary Clinton. In the same year, she was awarded the prestigious Swedish Anna Lindh Human Rights Prize, previously won by Madeleine Albright. She has also been named Safe's Global Hero of 2015, and a Global Thinker by Foreign Policy. In 2019, she received the Activism in Arts and Education award from the UN Women for Peace Association, UN Association USA's Global Citizen of 2019, and the Gandhi Foundation International Peace Award.

Dr Lederman was a Fulbright Fellow working with teachers at the Cradle of Humankind. She is presently on the Board of Directors of the National Association of Research in Science Teaching (NARST), and she has served on the Board of Directors of the National Science Teachers Association (NSTA).

I met Judy and her husband, Professor Norman Lederman, at the Southern African Research for Mathematics, Science and Technology Education Conference in 2009, and we have been firm friends since then.
